From January 2020, we will be introducing an offer of extended places in our Nursery. We are establishing up to 16 lunch club and afternoon places which will be offered to children attending our morning nursery, therefore creating a whole day attendance (8.45am to 3.45pm).

The additional sessions will not be covered by standard 'Universal' funding and will therefore have a fee attached to them, however those families eligible will be able to use the '30 hours' additional funding for the afternoon session. The structure of a whole day place will be as follows, the place will be offered for the whole term and full fees will apply, to be invoiced each term in advance:

Fees will be invoiced termly in advance. All parents taking part in the 30 hours extended day will be required to sign a copy of our terms and conditions prior to their child taking up the offer.

If more than 16 families request the extended day and have a valid eligibility code, places will be offered according to our admissions criteria;

- Children who are, or have been in public care.
- Children who have an exceptional medical or social need requiring attendance at Holy Trinity rather than any other school. Such needs must be supported, at the time of application, by reports or letters from suitable professionals such as consultants or social workers.
- Children who have siblings attending the school.
- Children living closest to Holy Trinity Nursery.
